CIVILIZATION ENCROACHING ON CAMP

Since 1950, when the original camp site of less than 15 acres was in a rather primitive stage, the camp has been somewhat secluded from "civilization." The camp site is nestled in the wooded hills adjacent to Fort Hill Memorial Park on one side and wooded land across Fort Hill Road on the other side. However, over the past several years, lots have been sold on Washburn Road (north of the camp — Washburn dead ends into Fort Hill Road at the campsite). Trailers and double-wides dot both sides of Washburn Road.

A land development company recently purchased 400 acres on both sides of Fort Hill Road between State Route 41 and the Fort Hill Memorial Park. Lots are currently being sold from the 400 acres by this company. The secluded nature of the camp is fast fading. Fortunately over the years, the trustees of Fort Hill Christian Youth Camp have added parcels of land to accommodate the needs of the camp program and to provide the buffer between the camp and home sites. The camp board purchased 13 acres west of the dining hall a few years after the establishment of the camp. Thereafter, parcels of land were purchased on the north side of Fort Hill Road.

Camp trustees continue to pursue the purchase of adjacent property to protect the interest of camp. Some property is available for purchase but funds are not available.
